WHY ACM?

CAMPUS APPLICATION PROCEDURES

1. Make an appointment with Amanda Ross in the Office of International and Off-Campus Studies to discuss your options.
2. Meet with the Financial Aid Office to discuss how off-campus study would affect your financial aid package.
3. Meet with the Registrar's Office to discuss how credit transfer works for your specific program.
4. Once you've chosen your program, start the process of applying for Cornell approval to study off-campus.
