CAMPUS APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Students must complete the MC application, available from the coordinator of off-campus study or on the Monmouth website. ACM application forms are available from the program advisor, coordinator of off-campus study, or the ACM website. An application consists of the following items:

1. Monmouth College application to study off-campus
2. Dean of Student's Recommendation Form
3. Application form for the ACM program to which you are applying (including essays and letters of recommendation)
4. Materials Checklist

The MC application requires signatures from the applicant, academic advisor, campus program advisor, and a financial aid officer. ACM applications also require the signatures of the academic advisor, academic dean, and dean of students- the applicant should obtain the academic advisor's signature, but not the deans' signatures (these will be obtained after the application has been approved).

Applicants can expect a decision about their on-campus review within a month of the deadline for receipt of applications.
